Salvation and Good Works - Part 2

(Ephesians 2:10)

Last week: Part 1

- I. Two **incorrect views** about salvation and good works:
 - 1) Salvation must be **earned** by adding good works to what Christ did on the cross.
 - 2) Good works have no **relationship** to salvation. (Matthew 7:21)
- II. Genuine salvation is the gift of God that will result in a life of **good works**.
 - 1) There is **no conflict** between Paul and James. (Romans 3:24, 28; James 2:18-26)
 - 2) Both men are saying the **<u>same</u> thing**, addressing different issues.
 - Paul was arguing that no one can ever be good enough to earn salvation.
 - James was attacking the view that saving faith does not at all times result in good Works.
 - He argues that genuine faith **always** produces good works.
 - 3) This is **exactly** what Paul was explaining in (Ephesians 2:10).
